Job Outline

An inspirational and committed Teacher of Cello is required to teach and help foster the strong musical tradition of Haileybury. It is expected that the successful candidate will be willing to contribute fully to the busy programme of ensembles and concerts within the School.

Purpose

The purpose of this job description is to set out the current principal duties of the post. It does not detail every individual task, and employees are required to undertake such tasks and duties as are allocated to them from time to time in accordance with the role. This job description will be reviewed annually as part of the School's annual performance review process.

Duties

- Be fully committed to maintaining the Department's high standards by showing a dynamic and inspirational approach to the subject and enthusing pupils with a love of music.
- Be fully committed to the ethos of the Department and willing to follow good practice guidelines as may from time to time be advised by the Director of Music.
- Coach individuals and groups of pupils ranging from beginners to diploma level when required.
- Be reliably available for teaching every week (hours to depend on pupil numbers).
- Set a good example to pupils in terms of appropriate dress, standards of punctuality and attendance.
- To maintain a code of confidentiality commensurate with the role.
- To remain up to date with all appropriate practices, procedures and regulatory requirements within your allocated areas of responsibility.
- To undertake duties in line with established Haileybury practices and protocols.
- To ensure that all work is supported with an appropriate paper trail i.e. supported by a filing system that contains clear and accurate working papers.
- To make use of appropriate computer software, equipment and facilities in order to complete duties in the most efficient and effective way.

Other Requirements

Safeguarding and Child Protection

All employees must be aware of their responsibilities for promoting and safeguarding the welfare of children and young persons with whom they may come into contact whilst at Haileybury. Employees must comply with the School's Safeguarding and Child Protection Policy and must be familiar with how to raise any safeguarding or child protection concerns.
