1. Purpose and scope of the policy

1.1. The aims of this policy include:

- To encourage sensible use of electronic devices
- To ensure pupils have adequate rest and quality of sleep.
- To allow pupils to have more time to be physically active and to socialise with others in person.
- To protect pupils from the negative effects of social media and online dangers.
- To encourage focus and minimise distraction during study.

2. Pupil use

No phones are permitted during the school day. Pupils will hand in their phone on arrival at their boarding house. Pupils' phones should be left in the secure lockers in House. Pupils may use their phones in the morning before lessons and after afternoon and evening activities.

No one may use a mobile phone in Quad or Memorial Quad at any time.

No electronic devices may be used after lights out by any pupil. All pupils will hand in their phones overnight on a school night

Pupils may only have access to phones after lights out with written permission from parents or guardians.

2.1 Other devices (laptops, desktop devices, tablets)

Only devices that are enrolled in the School's device management system may be used during lessons and then with specific permission of teachers.

Pupils are not permitted to wear any AI devices such as glasses or recording devices when at school. Any such devices should be handed to their House Parent arrival to school. Any such devices will be confiscated if found and investigated further by the School.

Airpods/headphones are permitted to be worn during free time.

Smart watches (Apple watches, Fitbits, etc.) are permitted, but must not be connected to smartphones during the school day.

3. Further guidance

3.1 Pupils must not have a "fake" phone, or second phone, to circumnavigate the rules.
